

Dear Parishioners,

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you. And then He breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit'". Jn 20:22

The great and wondrous Solemnity of Pentecost is so often overshadowed by the feasts of Christmas and Easter. This is not to take away the importance of those two solemnities, but rather to see them in connection to the entire message of salvation history that God has revealed in Jesus. Jesus has Risen from the dead and ascended to the Father, and today we mark the fulfillment of Jesus in sending the Holy Spirit upon the believers.

We hear in the Scriptures the marvelous works that were accomplished in the power of the Holy Spirit. People were able to hear the message of the Apostles in their own tongues; they were able to speak in different languages; the sick were healed, the dead raised and sins forgiven. WOW, how amazing and great is our God that He gives us the ability to act and to miraculous things in His name? AND that is what we MUST realize...we DO HAVE THAT POWER. At our baptism we had the Holy Spirit breathed upon us. And because of that, we can do wondrous things in the name of Jesus. St. Paul tells us today that there are many parts to the Body of Christ; different gifts; various forms of service BUT one Spirit. These gifts are from God and are called to be used for the glory of His name and for the good of all. What can stymie us at times is thinking that our gifts are not important or even worse, compare them to the gifts others have received. That is certainly the Evil One attempting to chip away at our confidence so that our gifts, instead of being shared, can be hidden away. How sad is that? Sad for ourselves and certainly sad for the Church. Each of us has been gifted by God in Jesus, and in being gifted we are called to share those gifts with the community. To be able to do so we must BELIEVE that the Holy Spirit received at that First Pentecost is the same Spirit, in all His power, that we received at Baptism and Confirmation. When we embrace the Holy Spirit wonderful things can be accomplished through us. But it takes faith; faith that we do have the Holy Spirit. It takes prayer to open us up to the voice of Jesus and most importantly we must believe that we are called and graced by God. A tall order for sure...but so freeing and empowering when it happens. Do not let this Pentecost pass without reflecting on the awesome power of the Holy Spirit that was "breathed on us." What is the Holy Spirit asking of you today?

Last week we had a wonderfully successful Ministry Fair. Many parishioners stopped by the ministry tables and the fellowship outside of Mass was so uplifting. What a joy it was to see such life and joy in our parish. I am so grateful to all those who have signed up for ministry in the Church. Thank you for your "yes" and answering the call of Stewardship. I want to express my gratitude for the many people who worked so hard to set up and took down the tents, booths, chairs and tables. Many thanks to the ministries who staffed the booths. A heartfelt thank you goes to Julie Byrne and Kevin Kelly who created the Ministry Booklets you received in the mail. PENTECOST SUNDAY, JUNE 12, 2011

In addition to widespread use of the color red, liturgical traditions associated with Pentecost throughout the world are rich and varied. Some date back many centuries. In the Middle Ages many larger churches in Europe were built with a "Holy Ghost hole"—a small circular opening in the roof that symbolized the entrance of the Holy Spirit into the assembly. The holes would be decorated with flowers and sometimes a dove figure would be lowered into the church at Pentecost. In Italian churches rose petals were and are thrown from the galleries over the congregation, representing the tongues of fire. In recent years origami doves have been dropped in some places. Be active in your own congregation's liturgical planning and bring some creative expressions to this most lively church feast and others throughout the year.

MONDAY, JUNE 13: ANTHONY OF PADUA

Saint Francis of Assisi was alive when Saint Anthony asked to join the friars, a desire prompted by the example of the first Franciscan martyrs, killed attempting to preach Christ in Morocco. But Anthony had grown up a Catholic in Lisbon, a city with much Muslim influence, which may have given him a respect for diversity and helped him realize he could be more useful to Christ by evangelization than martyrdom. As a scholar Anthony offered to teach the brothers and deepen their preaching. Even though Francis was cool toward the complexities of theology and oratory, he welcomed Anthony's wisdom and eloquence as a gift. If we must remember Anthony primarily as the finder of lost things, we should ask him to help us find paths of respect, careful thought, and reconciliation rather than competition and power.

TUESDAY, JUNE 14

Saint Thomas Aquinas once wrote: "Grace builds upon our nature and does not destroy it." It's a way of saying God works through our human nature but also that we need the gift of God's power—grace—to take us beyond our nature in order to meet the challenges of Christian love. Scripture speaks of that very well. What reason did Saint Paul offer to get the Corinthians to donate to the cause? The example of the Macedonians, who because of their faith were able to go beyond their condition of poverty and give. What did Jesus say in the Sermon on the Mount? Find

the strength to go beyond the human tendency to love only those in your group by remembering the love of God, which goes out to all. Ask God for these and other graces.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15

When we feel absolutely tapped out, it's tough to be generous. Yet even when we do not have much—a bit of bread, a kind word, a thoughtful gesture, a tiny seed of some kind—we are invited to offer it to others. It hardly makes sense to give when we feel empty, but therein lies the fertile ground of miracles, including the great miracle of creation, where we make something out of nothing—ex nihilo!

THURSDAY, JUNE 16

One of the many advantages of memorized prayers such as the "Our Father" is that we can say them when we have no words of our own; we don't have to think. That's also one of their disadvantages: We don't have to think. In fact, we may have forgotten exactly what we are saying when we pray the "Our Father." For example, do we really mean, "Thy will be done?" or are there unspoken conditions attached: "Thy will be done—as long as it doesn't interfere with my carefully laid plans for my life"? To turn everything over to God is truly the only way to live without fear. It's what Jesus did; it's what we are called to do as well.

FRIDAY, JUNE 17

It's a Friday in summer, hooray! The beach, ballpark, and backyard all beckon. Summer urges us to slow down and savor simple pleasures. Not only will we feel better, we will be better. Rest, relaxation, and retreat help us to absorb the sights and sounds around us and appreciate the people and things in our lives more. We are quicker to laugh, to love, to forgive, to give thanks. These are the treasures that have everlasting value.

SATURDAY, JUNE 18: BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Our world is full of vulnerable people in need of protection, such as the pregnant unwed teenager facing danger in countries where women must inhabit very narrow social categories, the refugee family fleeing an enemy across unfriendly borders, the widow having to rely on the charity of a son with no visible means of support, the mother holding her dead child in her arms, executed by the state. Mary of Nazareth moved through all of these precarious situations in her difficult life. Each time God's power was made perfect in her vulnerability. Ask for the grace you need.
