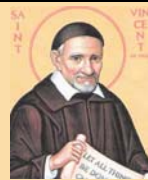

Dear Parishioners,

Lord, when my brother (sister) wrongs me how often must I forgive them, seven times? 'Mt 18:21

How many times have we asked or pondered this very question that St. Peter presents to Jesus? As a confessor it is surely one that comes up very often. The very act of forgiveness is an important one in our lives. Our Scripture readings from today speak so eloquently (and forcefully) of the need and power of forgivingness. St. Peter, in asking Jesus how many times he must forgive, uses the Hebrew understanding of forgiving a person seven times. Jesus probably shocks St. Peter and the other Disciples when He adds such a great number. Forgiveness for Jesus is the cornerstone for a believer. We hear in the Old Testament prophet Sirach that *'wrath and anger are hateful things yet the sinner hugs to them.'* Both Jesus and Sirach use examples of what happens when we don't forgive. Jesus uses the parable of the official who refuses to forgive a smaller debt than that which the king had forgiven to him. The king hears of it and hands his official to the torturers until he pays back what was owed him. Sirach says that God will not hear your prayers or forgive you unless you yourself are willing to forgive. The lesson is that if we want our sins forgiven, then we have to be willing to forgive those who sin against us. We are reminded that God forgives all of our sins and we have the responsibility to do the same. We do this, as difficult as it can be at times, because as St. Paul says, we must *'live for the Lord.'* If we want to claim Jesus as our own, then we have to be willing to live as He calls us. We know that forgiveness is not always easy and maybe at times the hurt is so great that forgiveness cannot be given at that exact moment. That's okay...what Jesus calls us to is the process of forgiveness. This means working on it, praying about it and maybe placing ourselves in the heart of the one who hurt us. Sometimes looking at life through their eyes, we can in tune our hearts to their pain and begin to understand them. Understanding can certainly help in the process of forgiveness.

Forgiveness is part of the Christian way of life because it is what Jesus commands. The benefit is not only that we act in Jesus and that we ourselves will be forgiven by the Father, BUT it helps our own spiritual life. Holding on to past hurts and holding back forgiving, Sirach tells us, is death and decay. How true that is! When we refuse to forgive another person or harbor those feelings of anger we do nothing to hurt them. It is the one who holds back that risks not only spiritual sickness but also emotional hurt. Lack of forgiveness is self poison that leads us to decay and death. It is in letting go that we can experience freedom. The freedom is that the actions of another person no longer have power or authority over our lives. We all know people who harbor those feelings of anger. What happens is that it is usually in the forefront of their minds. They find a need to keep bringing up the hurt and letting everyone know about it. It can at times take over their lives. What kind of freedom is that? What kind of peaceful life does that bring? The peace comes when we are able to let it go, certainly because Jesus tells us but also as important because Jesus knows what the inability to forgive can do to our health. So call someone today and ask for forgiveness or tell them you have forgiven them. If you cannot do that now...then at least begin the process. It will bring you peace.

This weekend we, as a nation and especially as New Yorkers, commemorate those horrendous events of **September 11, 2001**. I can still remember so vividly those days of sorrow, shock and sadness. I lost many friends in the Merrick Fire Department of which I was a Class A firefighter. I was also the Chaplain of Squad 288 in Queens. I spent a number of hours that first day at Ground Zero looking for survivors. Those will be memories I will never forget. Yet in all that, we can not, as Sacred Scripture tells us, seek vengeance but rather let us work for peace. Let us, in memory of all who died try to make the world a place where all feel heard and respected. May those who have died rest in peace and may their families and friends find hope and comfort in Jesus.

We have a number of great events coming up. The **Parish Picnic** and **Jesus Alive**. I encourage you to attend. The picnic is a wonderful relaxing time to gather as a parish. The Jesus Alive Concert can be a time of praise and worship.


