
Dear Parishioners,

#### Keep your eyes open, for you know not the day or the hour. MT 25:13

This past week we celebrated two beautiful feasts; All Saints and All Souls. Both of these feast days tie closely to our readings and to our ending of the Liturgical Year. These next few weeks before the first Sunday of Advent, the readings will be speak about the end of days. There will be a call to prepare ourselves for the Day of the Lord. The Gospel today exhorts us to stay awake and keep our eyes open "for we know not the time or the hour." The foolish virgins did not watch the oil in their lamps and when the bridegroom came they were not prepared. The wise ones made sure they had more than enough oil to keep the lamps burning. The Solemnity of All Saints commemorates, all those men and woman who spent their lives prepared for the coming of the Lord. They lived lives of holiness conscious of the presence of Jesus in their daily lives. When we think of the saints many of our favorites come to mind, St. Francis, St. Patrick, St. Anthony. We are blessed to have new saints Blessed Teresa of Calcutta and Blessed John Paul II. The saints are so important in the life of the Church, they are our heroes, the ones we look to not only as "good" people, but more importantly as Christians to emulate. We need these heroes more then ever in our world. Maybe there are even some saints in your family, since a saint is one who lives with God in heaven. The Feast of All Souls are the ones who may have lead good Christian lives yet still need our prayers to assist them on the journey to heaven. While they might not have been the "wise ones" they might also not fit into the category of the "unwise." So the Church prays for them and offers Masses for the repose of their souls. How wonderful our prayer is for those in purgatory! We can be of great assistance to them as they are "purged" of any weakness and failings. So great is the mercy of God that He wants no one to be separated from Him.

The Gospel poses a question for each of us. Are we prepared? Are there areas of our lives that are not fully in line with what Jesus asks of us? How open are we to God's will and the prompting of the Holy Spirit? Remember anger, hatred, stubbornness are never the will of God for us. The time of the Lord comes upon like a thief in the night...don't waste any more time!

Godparents must be fully initiated members of the Catholic Church (having received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), and provide a sponsor certificate. Marriage: Couples wishing to be married should call the parish office before any other arrangements are made. A minimum of six months is needed for marriage preparations.
