Dear Parishioners,

This week we will discuss the changes to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The beginning dialogue will follow the other changes in this dialogue..." The Lord be with you...and with your spirit. 'As the dialogue continues the priest will say, Give thanks to the Lord our God. 'The response will now be, It is right and just. This simpler response will then tie in more completely to the words of the priest in the Eucharistic Prayer II, It is truly right and just, our duty and salvation.''

In the words of institution or consecration, the most notable change will be in the words of the wine. The priest replaces the word "*cup* with "*chalice*. This change is meant to reflect that the vessel we use at Mass is not simply a cup we would use at home. That which holds the Precious Blood of Our Lord is sacrificial in nature. This Blood of Jesus was shed for the forgiveness of our sins.

As the Eucharistic Prayer continues, "for all'will be changed to for many.' As we heard before, this is a closer translation from the Sacred Scriptures and the words of Jesus in Saints Matthew and Mark. The change in wording does not alter what we believe as Catholics - that Jesus came to save all humanity.

The Mystery of Faith will be different. The familiar acclamation *Christ has died, Christ has Risen...*" will no longer be one of the options. The other acclamations are words of faith that are spoken to Jesus Himself: *We proclaim your death O Lord*,""When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup WE proclaim your death O Lord. The priest will also no longer will say, Let us proclaim the Mystery of faith but rather, The Mystery of faith. This is similar to the change from the ending of the readings that were changed a number of years ago from This is the Word of the Lord/This is the Gospel of the Lord. It states the reality without having to point to what we are or have done. It reflects a response of faith.

This next change may at first come off as sounding a little awkward. Before we come to Communion the present invitation says, "Behold the Lamb of God. Behold Him who takes away the sins of the world, happy are those who are called to His supper." The last part will now be replaced with Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." There are two key allusions to Scripture here: St. John the Baptist identifying Jesus as the Lamb and the angel's declaration in Revelation regarding those "called to the wedding feast of the Lamb." Our current response, Lord I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed will now be, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word, and my soul shall be healed" which comes from the words of the Centurion, who asked Jesus to heal his servant in Saints Luke and Matthew. As we come to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, let us look to that Centurion and come to Jesus with that same level of faith.

This past Sunday to Monday we were on retreat with our Confirmation Candidates. It was a wonderful experience of prayer, reflection and fun. I would like to thank our youth minister **Chris Mandato** for leading the retreat and to our DRE, **Karen Croce** for her hard work organizing the weekend.
