

Total Amount paid to date: \$374,436.00



SVDP Clothing Bins: A Great Resource...Let's Keep it That Way!

Our parish is fortunate to have two clothing bins from the Society of St. Vincent de Paul conveniently located adjacent to the Church on Carpenter Avenue.

HELP THE NEEDY: The clothing bins are a vital resource to the ongoing charity work of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Their primary purpose is to provide clothing to the St. Vincent de Paul thrift stores where people in need are provided with clothes free of charge. For those who are able to pay, the thrift store sells the clothes for very low prices. Clothing from these bins is also sold internationally to countries with populations in need.

The proceeds from these sales are used to fund the many programs managed by the Society (provision of new mattresses and bedding, transitional housing, financial assistance to families in crisis), which have benefited many people in need in our Parish area. Your local St. Vincent de Paul conference also receives direct funding from this great resource to provide to our needy neighbors.

CONVENIENT WAY TO DONATE: Another obvious benefit to these clothing bins is that they offer a convenient way to recycle clothing that your family no longer needs. Rather than storing clothes in bins in your attic or basement, you can bring them to the clothing bins and be confident that your clothes will be put to good use.

SPREAD THE WORD: CLOTHING ONLY: These bins are for clothing only—and the clothing must go inside the bins and not outside the bins in order to keep them clean. Unfortunately, people have begun to use the bins as a dumping ground for any and all unwanted household items (e.g., toys, furniture, computers, old videos). Many of these items are left outside the bins. As a result, this wonderful resource has become an eyesore.

Please spread the word concerning the charitable purpose and convenience of the clothing bins, but also let your neighbors know that the bins are for clothing only and the clothing should be put inside the bins. If there is no room in the bins, just wait a few days--we have asked the Society to pick up more frequently. For those other, non-clothing items, a quick internet search will reveal multiple charities willing to come and pick up donated items from your home (e.g. www.donationtown.org), but save your clothing for our local SVDP clothing bins! As always, we thank you for your continued generosity and support.

Dear Parishioners.

"This is my beloved, my Son. Listen to Him" MK 9:7

Today's gospel offers us a good summary of the Christian life. The mountain experience is what we are doing today as we gather for worship and nourishment. With the eyes of faith we see Jesus in His glory. For us today, it is hidden under the form of Bread and Wine. While the valley, that place where the Disciples had to go back to, symbolizes where we go after today's celebration. We leave here to obey the words of the Father to listen to Jesus and so live out our Christian vocation. The valley can be that place of holiness if we hear the command and take up the cross to follow Jesus in service to others.

That's not how a lot of us view holiness, is it? We are so often filled with the many things our lives ask of us daily to accomplish. There is feeding the kids; going to the office or factory; looking for a job; paying our bills. We may be worried about our health; encountering a sadness and the many things that fill our days and nights. But in the midst of all these, Lent still invites us to look beneath the surface of our daily lives to see the place where Jesus is revealed to us. We might not encounter the wonder of those Disciples who saw Jesus transfigured and saw His divinity. Maybe the Father doesn't speak as clearly to us as He did to those Disciples who are told to listen to Jesus. BUT that same God wants us to see the Jesus in our midst.

So how can we feel and encounter the presence of Jesus? Let us go back to Sacred Scripture, "This is my Beloved Son, listen to Him." The operative word is "LISTENING". To desire to follow Jesus is, is of course wonderful, but it takes more then just a desire. We have to know who Jesus is and knowing Him we can then follow. To know what Jesus wants of us we need to enter that place of silence. It is in that place of silence that we can hear and listen to His voice. Lent is a time to block out, or at least push aside the many voices that clamor for our attention. Many of those voices can certainly distract us from listening to Jesus, so the work is to focus. We can only focus if we allow ourselves time of silence during the day. Come away, open the Word and ponder what Jesus is trying to say. It isn't as difficult as it sounds, it just takes time and a desire to listen. Give yourself that gift this Lent, the gift of listening.

I also encourage you to take advantage of the gift of healing and forgiveness that is found through the Sacrament of Confession. Come to Jesus and hear His words of forgiveness as He unburdens you of your sins. It can be so freeing and a blessing for the journey. Don't let pride or the Evil One keep you from experiencing God's mercy.

I am very excited about our St. Patrick's Supper on Saturday March 17th. This will be the 110th St. Patrick's Supper our parish has had. It is a relaxing and fun evening for adults and children. The St Patrick's Day Parade will take place in Glen Cove on Sunday, March 18th.



Parish Registration: We welcome all new members of our parish family. We ask all parishioners to welcome and invite new neighbors and their families to become a part of St. Boniface Martyr Parish. Parish registration (census) forms available by the main doors of the church and in the parish office for new members. Please return completed forms to the parish office.

Baptism: Parents wishing to present a child for Baptism should be registered members of St. Boniface Martyr Parish. Parents are required to have a Baptism Preparation Interview and attend a Baptism class. Baptisms are celebrated on the last Sunday of the month. Godparents must be fully initiated members of the Catholic Church (having received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), and provide a sponsor certificate. Please call 676-0676 to pre-arrange.

Marriage: Couples wishing to be married should call the parish office before any other arrangements are made. A minimum of six months is needed for marriage preparations.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): An ongoing process of formation for those who ever wonder if they should become "Catholic". If interested, please call Fr. Bob at 676-0676.
