

Dear Parishioners,

## Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." John 6:57

Last week we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, which is not meant to simply be explained, but rather encountered as mystery - a mystery that is meant to be pondered to draw us into the mystery of God. Today we celebrate another Solemnity that is meant more to be pondered that explained. This Solemnity of Corpus Christi, or the Body and Blood of Christ, doesn't need theological explanations; they will never be enough. What we need is faith and trust. Trust that the Word of Jesus is true.

Many Christians believe that Jesus was speaking metaphorically and not literally about His Body and Blood but rather to feed on the "Word" that Jesus came to preach. While the Word is certainly important and that understanding would be easier to accept it is certainly NOT what Jesus was saying. If it were, He would have clarified His teaching when many who could not accept it turned away. What Jesus says is to reiterate more strongly His words and this teaching. After many leave Him, He turns to the Apostles and says *Will you leave me too?* "This would have been the opportune time to explain a different teaching to His Disciples so they would understand more clearly. Yet there is nothing. So we conclude from this teaching and others in the Scriptures that Jesus wants to give us His very Self as food for our journey. This teaching has be believed from the earliest times in the life of the Church. We share this continual believe in the Real and True presence of Jesus in the Eucharist with our Orthodox sisters and brothers. As the Churches founded by Jesus we have kept faithful to this beautiful yet difficult teaching.

Like the Trinity, we again encounter mystery. Theologians have attempted to help us grasp this mystery through the teaching of Transubstantiation. This states that the accidents (external presence) remains the same but its substance changes into the Body and Blood of Jesus. So bread still looks and tastes like bread but is reality the Body of Christ. The same would be true for the accidents of the wine and its change into the Blood of our Lord.

Again, this is helpful but falls short of the beauty of what Jesus intends. What we need is faith to see past the accidents and to believe what Jesus intends. Faith acknowledges this great and wondrous Sacrament so that He may become part of us as food for our journey and that hopefully we become what we eat and drink...namely more like Jesus Himself.

So what do we believe? After the priest calls down the Holy Spirit on the gifts of bread and wine they truly BECOME the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Himself. Not a symbol, not a mirror of something else, BUT Jesus Himself. Have you ever pondered while walking up to communion that you will cradle in your hands or on your tongue the true Body and Blood of our Savior? This awesome and humbling gift is Jesus' abiding presence to us.

We come to Mass to receive Jesus as Savior and Lord. The changes in the Liturgy have helped us to refocus and continue to acknowledge Jesus as Lord and to remind us that we gather to worship this wondrous presence among us. May we stand in awe at this mystery, BUT more importantly, may it cause us to seek Jesus and become more like Him whom we consume.

# Take Five for Faith

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ
What has the church been celebrating on this day ever since
the 13th century? If your answer is the gift of the Real
Presence of Jesus in both the Body and Blood of the
Eucharist, you would of course be correct. Is it also a feast to
glorify the communion you have with Jesus through the
sacrament? Definitely. Tradition also emphasizes another
aspect of the Eucharist: its effect. Now, an effect can be
passive, something you receive, or active, moving you to do
something. In the "effects" of the Eucharist you have both:
oneness with God as well as a call to imitate Jesus' sacrificial
love in your own life. Today is a good day to rededicate
yourself to just that.

# Monday, June 11

# Feast of St. Barnabas, apostle

Did Gentile converts have to become Jews in order to become Christians? Confused yet? Well, so was the early church, until the matter was settled at the Council of Jerusalem around the year 50 A.D. The council decided that Gentiles (that is, everyone who wasn't Jewish) did not have to keep most of the Mosaic Law in order to become followers of Christ. Saint Barnabas was instrumental in helping Saint Paul evangelize and lead the church to this fundamental decision, one that essentially turned Christianity from a branch of Judaism into the largest of the world religions. Of course, bigger doesn't necessarily mean better—that part is up to each member of the Body of Christ. So make Barnabas proud by living up to the ideals he lived and, as a martyr, died for.

## Tuesday, June 12

Salt is such an ordinary, cheap, and easily found substance nowadays that you can fail to fully grasp the profound meaning of Jesus' famous metaphor. Consider these facts. Once known as "white gold," salt is necessary for human life. It preserves, purifies, and enhances the flavor of food. It made civilization possible. Wars have been waged over supplies of salt; it has been taxed, hoarded, traded, and used as currency; and it helped galvanize Mohandas Gandhi's nonviolent movement for India's independence from Britain. When Jesus compares his disciples to salt of the earth, he is really saying: "Your life and presence matter. In fact, you are more than valuable, you are essential." Be alert for opportunities to be salt for the world today.

# Wednesday, June 13

## Feast of St. Anthony of Padua

Saint Francis of Assisi had a healthy skepticism about academic pursuits. In the Middle Ages the accolades a noted

scholar might enjoy could leave gospel poverty in the dust. When Anthony of Padua asked to join Francis' new "Order of Penance," however, Francis saw that Anthony was able to combine brilliance and oratorical power with fidelity to the gospel and simplicity. Francis even welcomed Anthony to bring his precious books with him—they were the tools of his trade—and entrusted to his care the training of brothers seeking to become priests. You may find yourself juggling values that seem at odds with each other, like being a bread earner and a caring mom or dad. Saint Anthony knew that the gifts of God—even those most esteemed like intelligence, power, and wealth—are still gifts.

# Thursday, June 14

The American flag was adopted on this day in 1777, and for the past 235 years it has been a cherished symbol of everything this country holds dear. As President Calvin Coolidge observed, "It represents our peace and security, our civil and political liberty, our freedom of religious worship, our family, our friends, our home." But, he noted, it is equally a symbol of responsibility. As a nation the United States has its share of problems, disagreements, and failures. Today is a good day to reflect on the sacrifices your ancestors made and consider how you might carry on their work so that your grandchildren may live in the freedom the Stars and Stripes proclaim.

# Friday, June 15

#### Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Last spring a friend received from his ailing elderly mother two small oval portraits of Jesus and Mary nestled inside matching gilt frames, their special hearts radiantly visible. Finding these images a bit too sentimental for his tastes, he put them in a drawer. When his mother died on the night of June 15, he noted to us who knew him: "She died between the two hearts she loved best." The oval portraits now hang on his wall, reminding him of the love that surrounds everyone at all times. Celebrate the twin feasts of holy hearts today and tomorrow with gratitude for how God so loves the world.

Characters in the Bible can seem larger than life because of the singular roles they play in human history. Yet even a prophet won't leave home without kissing his folks goodbye!
