The second quarterly payment is due on or before **September 30**, **2012**. Credit Card payments are processed the last day of each month



In last week's issue I explained the meaning of faith. This week I want us to focus on s me of the factors that derail our faith namely our reason, past experiences and moments of crisis. There are many things that can affect our faith. One major factor is our reason, our mind. Sometimes our reason tells us that God cannot give what we want. To our finite man we think that God cannot grant it. A story is told of a man who was being chased by a tiger. He ran as hard as he could until he was at the edge of a cliff with the tiger in hot pursuit. The man looked over the edge of the cliff and saw a branch growing out of the side of the cliff a few feet down. He jumped down and grabbed the branch just as the tiger reached the cliff. The tiger growled viciously as the man sighed a great sigh of relief. Just then a mouse came out from a crevice and began to chew on the branch. The man looked down to what was a drop of a thousand feet and sure death and looked to the heavens and yelled out, "Dear God, if you are there, please help. I will do anything you ask but please help." Suddenly a voice came booming down from heaven, "You will do anything I ask?" it questioned. The man shocked to hear a reply to his plea yelled back, "I will gladly do anything you ask, but please save me." The voice from heaven then replied, "There is one way to save you but it will take courage and faith." The branch began to weaken from the mouse and the tiger was still growling a few feet above the man, "Please, Lord, tell me what I must do and I will do it. Your will is my will." The voice from heaven then said, "All right then, let go of the branch." The man looked down to a fall of a thousand feet and certain death. He looked up at the hungry tiger a few feet away and he looked at the mouse still chewing on the branch. Then he looked up at the heavens and yelled, "Is there anyone else up there?" Human reasoning became an obstacle to him. Let us believe in what Jesus says in Matthew 19:26, With God all things are possible.'

Another obstacle to faith is our past negative experiences. Sometimes we contemplate "what ifs" and "whys" certain things happen. If there are instances in the past were our faith was not rewarded, we tend to think that in the present our faith will not meet God's approval. What about the good things God has done: the mountains we climbed, the rivers we crossed, and those paths that led to us victory. Instead of allowing our past negative experiences to affect us, let us rather count our past blessings from God and move in confidence.

Another issue that affects our faith is the crises we go through. I remember the story of a woman who was called while at Sunday Mass only to be told that her house was on fire. Sometimes, a car accident, a loss of a child, a loss of job, barrenness or childlessness, certain diseases can serve to injure our faith. No matter what the crises are, we can take a cue from Paul. He went through a lot of crises. He says, Five times I have received from the Jews the forty lashes minus one. Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I received a stoning. Three times I was shipwrecked; for a night and a day I was adrift at sea; on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from bandits, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers and sisters; in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, hungry and thirsty, often without food, cold and naked (2Cor 11:23-27). Regardless of all these difficult moments, in Romans 8:35-39 Paul says Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?... No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. Are you going through any crises? Are they affecting your faith in God? Conquer with your faith!

Do not allow the obstacles to your faith to grow bigger than your faith itself because with faith you can climb every mountain and cross every river.
