UNITED STATES CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS

USCCB RESPONDS TO INACCURATE STATEMENT OF FACT ON HHS MANDATE MADE DURING VICE PRESIDENTIAL DEBATE

WASHINGTON—The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) issued the following statement, October 12. Full text follows:

Last night, the following statement was made during the Vice Presidential debate regarding the decision of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to force virtually all employers to include sterilization and contraception, including drugs that may cause abortion, in the health insurance coverage they provide their employees:

“With regard to the assault on the Catholic Church, let me make it absolutely clear. No religious institution—Catholic or otherwise, including Catholic social services, Georgetown hospital, Mercy hospital, any hospital—none has to either refer contraception, none has to pay for contraception, none has to be a vehicle to get contraception in any insurance policy they provide. That is a fact. That is a fact.”

This is not a fact. The HHS mandate contains a narrow, four-part exemption for certain “religious employers.” That exemption was made final in February and does not extend to “Catholic social services, Georgetown hospital, Mercy hospital, any hospital,” or any other religious charity that offers its services to all, regardless of the faith of those served.

HHS has proposed an additional “accommodation” for religious organizations like these, which HHS itself describes as “non-exempt.” That proposal does not even potentially relieve these organizations from the obligation “to pay for contraception” and “to be a vehicle to get contraception.” They will have to serve as a vehicle, because they will still be forced to provide their employees with health coverage, and that coverage will still have to include sterilization, contraception, and abortifacients. They will have to pay for these things, because the premiums that the organizations (and their employees) are required to pay will still be applied, along with other funds, to cover the cost of these drugs and surgeries.

USCCB continues to urge HHS, in the strongest possible terms, actually to eliminate the various infringements on religious freedom imposed by the mandate.

Take Five for Faith

Sunday, October 21, 2012

World Mission Sunday

There are at least two positions from which to lead a group of people. One is from the front, where a person leads by inspiring example. The other is from the rear, where one leads by compromise and consensus. Throughout his life, Nelson Mandela led from one or the other of these positions. As he and his African National Congress comrades were about to enter prison, for example, Mandela went in first to model how to respond to the guards' taunts. Later, as president of South Africa, he relied on group wisdom to solve the country's problems. Underlying all of Mandela's actions was the African philosophy of *ubuntu*: the understanding that *my humanity is inextricably intertwined with yours*. Is that your leadership style?

Monday, October 22

In a capitalist society, one does not often hear the condemnation of greed, automatically assuming that it is right, just, and simply smart to amass more, especially in hard times. Yet the U.S. Catholic bishops wrote in 1987 "All of us must examine our way of living in light of the needs of the poor. Christian faith and the norms of justice impose distinct limits on what we consume and how we view material goods. . . . Americans are challenged today as never before to develop the inner freedom to resist the temptation constantly to seek more. Only in this way will the nation avoid what [Pope] Paul VI called 'the most evident form of moral underdevelopment,' namely greed."

Tuesday, October 23

Feast of St. John of Capistrano

According to one biographer, three words characterized the problem-solving attitude of the Franciscan Saint John of Capistrano (b. 1386): "Initiative. Organization. Activity." At a time of religious apathy and confusion in central Europe, John's tireless travel and preaching attracted great crowds, and he and his Franciscan brethren were instrumental in reviving the moribund faith. Optimism and hard work can indeed bear fruit. The next time you feel discouraged by slow progress or obstacles, remember Saint John's enthusiastic spirit and make it your own.

Wednesday, October 24

It was a huge step for the early community of believers in Jesus to realize they needed to bring the Good News about him to non-Jews in the larger world. Two thousand years later the church would take another

huge leap when it held its 21st "ecumenical"—"of the whole world"—council, Vatican II, where, the great theologian Karl Rahner said, "The church appeared for the first time as a world church in a fully official way." A world church, however, has to act like one, Rahner said. "It begins to act through the reciprocal influence exercised by all its components." In other words, the different parts of the church need to learn from one another. Consider yourself a citizen of such a world church!

Thursday, October 25

Zeal for God's mission was personified, and indeed incarnated, in the person of Jesus the Christ. Jesus' passion to serve others and to share the gospel was one of his enduring gifts to his disciples then and now. It wasn't only about the "doing" of the faith, however, but of fully becoming what one loved and believed. A story from the desert fathers and mothers illustrates that well: "Abba Lot went to see Abba Joseph and said, 'Abba as far as I can I say my little office [prayers], I fast a little, I pray and meditate, I live in peace and as far as I can, I purify my thoughts. What else can I do?' Then the old man stood up and stretched his hands toward heaven. His fingers became like ten lamps of fire and he said to him, 'If you will, you can become all flame.' "

Friday, October 26

We may inwardly cheer when Jesus calls the Pharisees hypocrites, but if we read the gospels carefully, we'll see that Jesus, in frustration, sometimes calls *everyone* in the crowd hypocrites. What riles his holy heart? Willful refusal to see what is before us. So Jesus complains that while we predict the weather more or less accurately, it seems we can't see what is around us and is so much more important than whether or not it will rain. While Jesus is generous and forgiving, even he can erupt in sadness and anger at the folly of which humans are capable, to their own loss—even eternal loss—which is exactly what he wishes to save us from.

Saturday, October 27

Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On this final Saturday of Rosary month, the church stops to reflect on five occasions of glory: Christ's Resurrection and Ascension, Pentecost, and Mary's Assumption and Crowning. The Sorrowful Mysteries have met their match: Death is answered with new life, humiliation with honor, fear with Spirit-filled courage, abandonment with rescue, and a wounding crown with a holy one. We remember those separated from us by death and pray for their reception into glory. We also ask for an outpouring of the Spirit's gifts upon the church as we pray the "Glorious Mysteries" today.
