Total Amount paid to date: \$627,200.00



Take Five for Faith

Sunday, January 13

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

While the Christmas season ends today, we celebrate a beginning: The Baptism of the Lord, the second of this month's "epiphanies"—revelations of Jesus to be Lord—after the official one last Sunday. We move from figures who populated Jesus' childhood to the adult Christ about to embark on his mission of redeeming the world. Jesus, apparently, was the last person John baptized, the crown of the latter's ministry. John's message of repentance for sins, symbolized in washing in water, expanded into the Spirit coming down upon Christ in declaring an era when God is visiting new opportunities for salvation on the world. The Lord is offering you an eternity of life and love, now and forever. Will you take him up on it?

Monday, January 14

A friend observed that Catholics seem to really rush things: No sooner is Christmas over and we're already marking Jesus' grown-up ministry, and, soon, the events of his Passion will unfold. Of course the liturgical year is not intended to represent an exact chronology of Jesus' daily life. On the other hand there is something bracing about moving from the warm sentiments of Christmas and plunging into what the Incarnation means and demands of us. We take up Mark's gospel, which gives us not a baby Jesus surrounded by angels, magi, or even doting parents but a fiery, determined prophet throwing open the squeaky gates of the kingdom and whose first words are an imperative: Follow me there.

Tuesday, January 15

These days the word *amazement* has a generally positive connotation, implying wonder and admiration. But the further back you trace the word's origins, the darker the meaning gets—from "perplex" back to "confuse" and "confound" back to "delude" and "make weary" to "stupefy" and all the way back to an ancient Greek word for "folly"! So when we hear that the crowds were *amazed* by the power of Jesus' words, we should not assume they were celebrating! Jesus' message was—and still is—astonishing because it calls for a complete upending of many of the conventions on which daily life is based. Read a gospel all the way through, as you would any other great book, and see for yourself. You will be amazed!

Wednesday, January 16

It's mid-January, the holiday excitement is behind us, and it is easy to slip into the wintry mix of gloom and dullness. We're back to reality and the seemingly boring routine of our lives. But often it is in our ordinary lives

that we can experience the extraordinary grace of God. It all begins with prayer. Many saints from Teresa of Avila to Josemaria Escrivá encourage us to talk to God in conversation, where we will get to know God and ourselves better. Use this quiet ordinary time in the weeks ahead to spend time talking to God. You just may discover some extraordinary things about who you are and what God has in store for you.

Thursday, January 17

A woman is being chased by tigers. She comes to the edge of a cliff and sees a vine growing out of the rock. She climbs down and holds on. Looking down, she sees tigers pacing below her. Then she sees a bunch of beautiful, ripe strawberries growing within arm's reach. She picks one, puts it into her mouth, and enjoys its delicious sweetness. Sometimes all we can do is eat the strawberry that is right in front of us. Yet memory and imagination, though divine gifts, can ensnare us in regret for the past or fear of the future. All we truly have is today, this moment. Today is a good day to practice being in the present moment.

Friday, January 18

"Getting your act together" isn't easy, but it's sure to be simpler than getting the Body of Christ back together. Which is why today we begin once more an annual week dedicated to promoting Christian unity. Unity is essential to the nature of the church, as Jesus prayed to his Father at the Last Supper: "So that they may be one, as we are one" (John 17:22). Fractures threatened unity as early as the fourth century. The schism between Eastern Orthodox believers and Roman Catholics ruptured the church in the 11th century. The Reformation produced a wedge between Protestants and Catholics in the 16th century. Help heal our history by adding a daily prayer for Christian unity this week.

Saturday, January 19

Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Protestants plunged into the ecumenical movement first, in 1910. Pope Leo XIII had already codified the Roman position in 1896: God-given unity resides in the Catholic Church. If the Catholic Church had unity, it did not need to seek it. When the World Council of Churches was formed in 1948, Catholics were not among its members—although Pope Pius XII did propose rules for Catholic participation in ecumenical conversations that same year. Vatican Council II embraced the cause by instigating what's now called the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity. Read what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says about ecumenism (nos. 820-822).

Baptism: Parents wishing to present a child for Baptism should be registered members of St. Boniface Martyr Parish. Parents are required to have a Baptism Preparation Interview and attend a Baptism class. Baptisms are celebrated on the last Sunday of the month. Godparents must be fully initiated members of the Catholic Church (having received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist), and provide a sponsor certificate. Please call 676-0676 to pre-arrange.

Marriage: Couples wishing to be married should call the parish office before any other arrangements are made. A minimum of six months is needed for marriage preparations.
