Payments are due as follows: Monthly payments are due on/ before the last day of the month. **Next monthly payments are due on January 30, 2013.**



Dear Parishioners,

"Do Whatever He tells you." JN 2:5

It amazes me that many of our Christian sisters and brothers cannot see in Sacred Scripture the role that Mary, Our Blessed Mothers, plays in salvation history. St. Luke's Gospel tells us *"that every generation will call her blessed."* Today at the Wedding Feast of Cana, which begins Jesus' ministry, there is Mary, right in the midst. She is present with a mother's heart. She sees that the wine will run out and that it will cause embarrassment and pain for the bridal couple and their families. So Mary brings the problem to Her Son Jesus. Mary gives us those most important words, words that define Her ministry for all generations. She tells the wine steward to "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus is propelled into His own ministry by the prompting of His Mother. Jesus, as an child of the Mosaic Law would have of course been not only obedient but also open to His Mother's wisdom. So here we have Mary, the handmaiden of the Lord, continuing the work the Father gave Her at the Annunciation. This story is not only important to the bridal couple at today's wedding but to all of us for all eternally. Mary says to us what she said to the steward, "Do whatever He tells you." This is Mary's role, she shows us Jesus and encourages us to discover Him. As a mother She would have known Him intimately. That intimacy came about through Her relationship with Him. A relationship of freely giving Herself to Him. The same must be true for us. Like Mary, our relationship deepens with Jesus when we are willing to give ourselves to Him. To know Him through the reading of the Bible and a prayer life that is centered in Him. Mary's life of faithfulness is a model for us. She gave Her life in service and used Her gifts for the glory of God.

In Our second reading today St. Paul reminds us "that there are many gifts but one Spirit." A wonderful way for us to grow closer to Jesus is to do what Our Lady did, she discovered Her gift, a mother's heart, and used it as a means of holiness. A holiness that drew her closer to Jesus. We all have been gifted, not all the same surely but all of importance and needed to make the Body of Christ whole. The difficulty can be two-fold. First discovering what that gift is and secondly, accept that it is important. We may think that what God has asked us to do or gifted us with is not very important to the working of the Kingdom. We should never downplay what we have to offer. If it is our gift and given to us by God, then the Father has a plan for it. Be open to the plan it will help in accepting the beauty of the gifts given to each of us. We are special and what we have to offer is important. Mary teaches us that. Learn from Her maternal love. She wants to show you Her Son.

As we enter the Flu Season I would like to bring back the guidelines from last year. If you are sick or feeling a little under the weather please refrain from partaking in the precious Blood of Our Lord. Though medical studies show that the feasibility of "catching" anything from the chalice is slim, let's not take any chances. I also ask that if you are sick and usually receive the Body of Lord on the tongue, that until you are feeling better please receive the Host in your hands. The same caution should be taking during the Sign of Peace. IF you are sick, simply cross your hands over your chest or fold your hands, as you turn to those around you and wish them the Lord's peace. During the Lord's Prayer many people join hands. I ask that we always respect those who are not comfortable in this practice. Again, they may be sick; suffering from joint pain that makes holding hands painful or just their personal choice not to hold hands. We always need to be respectful of personal decisions. So if it is your way, then simply hold your hand out and if the person sitting next to you wishes to join hands let it be their decision. I remind the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to use the hand sanitizer by the side credence table.

For the next two weekends our second graders will be receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I want to congratulate them on this next step in their faith development. Let us pray for them and all people that all may come frequently to this wonderful Sacrament of healing.

In this year of faith I continue to encourage you to pray for those who may be away from worship...let the power of the Holy Spirit touch them.

Our **Headmaster's Ball** is coming up. I want to congratulate **Jean Stratford** who is being honored at the Ball from our parish for her work with Catholic Education.

The days of Thanksgiving and Christmas were busy times for our Outreach Ministry. We provided 150 food baskets and 115 food cards for Thanksgiving and 125 food baskets and 146 food cards for Christmas. I would like to thank **Bernie Mc Grath, Richard Mercadante, Eileen Bowersock, John Moran, Timothy Brady, John Zabielski, Susan Winslow, Joan Schiller; Chris Mandato** and the **St. Boniface Youth Group, Karen Croce** and the **Confirmation Students**. Thanks also to **Bob Clancy, John Zabielski** and **Neil Miritello** for providing trucks and equipment to help Outreach in obtaining food. 
