

The fee for this years program is \$100 per child or \$180 for families with more than one child enrolled.

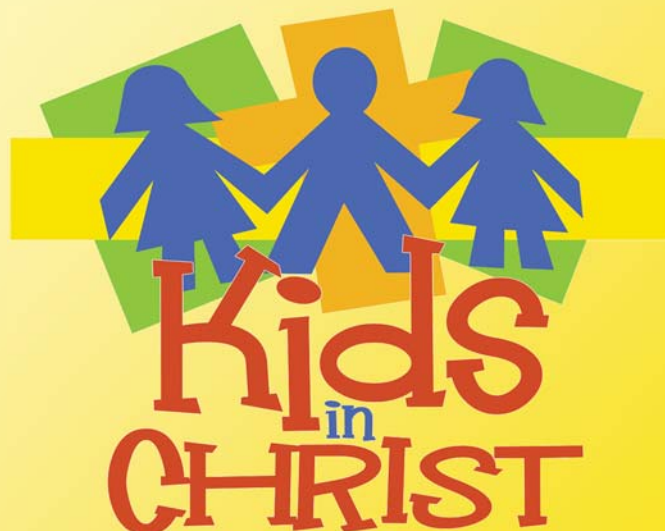

✠ Sunday, July 27

Parents Day was established in the U.S. in 1994—the same year the United Nations and the Vatican sponsored “years” in honor of the family. All of these events were meant to highlight the important role families play in society and offer parents recognition and encouragement. “The families that children grow up in . . . can have major effects on their well-being,” according to a 2013 U.S. Census Bureau report. Or put more simply, “If there is no love then there is no joy,” said Pope Francis in anticipation of the October 2014 Vatican Synod on Families. Do your part to ensure that the children in your family and community are loved. Begin with an understanding heart.

✠ Monday, July 28

If you “get your hands into” making bread, you know the mystery of leavening. It makes the dough rise, and as it bakes an irresistible fragrance fills the air. The yeast pervades the dough and turns it into bread. In some European villages on Saturday, the whole town would fill with the aroma of baking bread. No wonder Jesus used such a homely image for the kingdom of heaven. Once the Word of Christ has been incorporated, *kneaded*, into human experience, the whole rises. You come alive. Christ fills every space, every soul. Put on your apron. There’s work to do.

✠ Tuesday, July 29

Memorial of St. Martha

It appears that the pressure on women to be perfect housekeepers and hostesses existed all the way back to biblical times. Like her namesake Martha Stewart, Saint Martha was trying to be a domestic dynamo. Can you blame her when she had someone like Jesus for a guest? And her sister Mary had the gall to sit around and socialize with him without helping out! Jesus chides Martha—affectionately, you can tell. He tells her to do as Mary does and focus on what matters most: the people in our midst.

✠ Wednesday, July 30

Memorial of St. Peter Chrysologus

Peter Chrysologus, whose name means “golden-worded,” had the right idea as a preacher: He worked hard on his sermons because he feared that otherwise he would bore people! Though he lived more than

1,500 years ago, his inspired form of preaching never goes out of style. Make sure those who preach effectively in your own faith community know you appreciate the effort they put into their sermons. And if you find the preaching less than inspiring, offer that feedback as well—in a constructive manner, with ideas that can help. Great preaching is learned through practice and reaction—oh, yes, and attentive, engaged listening!

✠ Thursday, July 31

Memorial of St. Ignatius of Loyola

“Act as if everything depended on you; trust as if everything depended on God,” said Saint Ignatius of Loyola. He was a person of action, guided by deep faith. In ups and downs Ignatius sought to find God and help others do the same. Ignatius allowed God to shape his life and the religious order he founded, the Society of Jesus, and left a rich spiritual legacy for generations to come. In honor of Ignatius, consider the ways you allow God to shape your lives.

✠ Friday, August 1

Memorial of St. Alphonsus Liguori

It’s not always easy to speak the truth. All too often sharing what’s right and true meets opposition, hurt, and insult. Yet being true to who you are, what you believe, and what that belief calls you to can make all the difference. Saint Alphonsus Ligouri, moral theologian and founder of the Redemptorists, knew that. Alphonsus was a priest for and of the people. Speaking with simplicity and kindness, he won the hearts of many while sharing hard moral realities. Truth isn’t always easy, but shared with compassion it has the power to transform lives and truly be Good News.

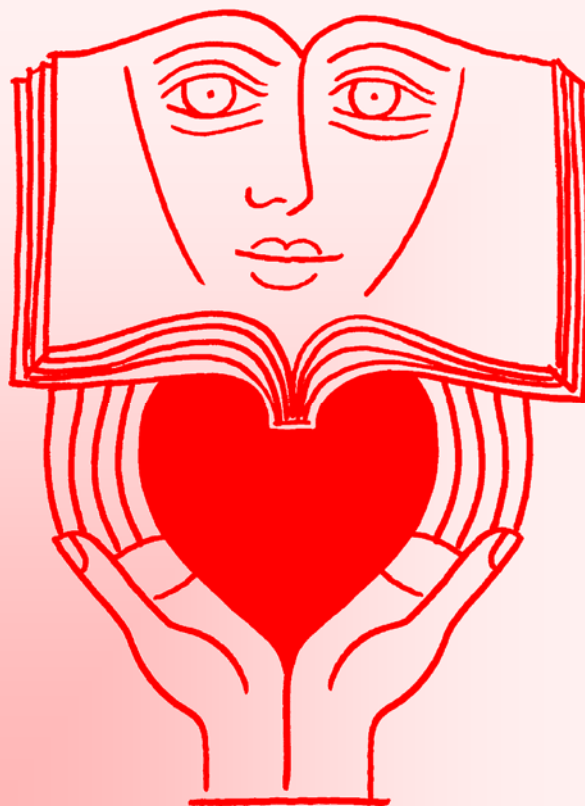
✠ Saturday, August 2

Memorial of St. Eusebius of Vercelli

Around the year 300 A.D., Eusebius realized that clergy were healthier and holier when they had the support of a community. As bishop of Vercelli in Piedmont in northwest Italy, he was the first to link the monastic life with that of the clergy, establishing a community of his diocesan priests. In the modern age, clergy and others in ministry sometimes get isolated. Make sure the pastoral workers who care for you have people to be with when the work is done and it is time to unwind. You can be part of their extended community by inviting them to dinner once in a while. Lively conversation guaranteed!

The Gospel of the Lord!

From the beginning, reading from one of the four gospels has been a high point of our Sunday assembling to give thanks and praise. For good reason, too. Christ comes to us in word as well as in deed, in the scriptures as well as in the sharing of his body and blood. And while we know that God speaks to us in all of holy scripture, at Mass we are most eager to hear the gospel, the good news of the very words and deeds of Jesus. (That is what the Old English word “gospel” means after all, “good news,” “God’s news.”) So when it is time, we jump to our feet. We acclaim the coming of the gospel with that most ancient and holy of words: Alleluia! (Unless it is Lent, our season of sorrow when we fast from our glorious word just like Israel in exile hung up its harps.) Fast to our feet, singing loud praise, we watch as the deacon (or the priest) takes up the Book of the Gospels. Accompanied by servers with candles, perhaps with fragrant clouds of incense from another server’s bowl, the Book of the Gospels makes its way through our assembly from altar to ambo. It sits on the altar from the start of Mass as a sign that Christ is present in the gospel. Now it is taken “up to the heights” to be proclaimed from the ambo, just as Jesus preached the sermon on the mount, or the apostles, drunk with the Holy Spirit, shouted joy from Jerusalem’s Pentecost rooftops. As the deacon announces that this is from Matthew or Mark, from Luke or John, we trace the sign of the cross on our foreheads (may we understand this good news!), on our lips (may we always speak and spread this good news!), and over our hearts (may we love and always



live this good news!) Then we listen. We stand together and listen. We stand and listen like a servant being given orders, like an honored guest being whose deeds are recounted, like a convicted criminal before the judge’s bench, like the beloved being met in haste by the lover. And when it is spoken, when the last word for this day has sunk deep within, the deacon looks to us and says, “The gospel of the Lord!” to which we cry, “Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!” What else could we possibly say?
