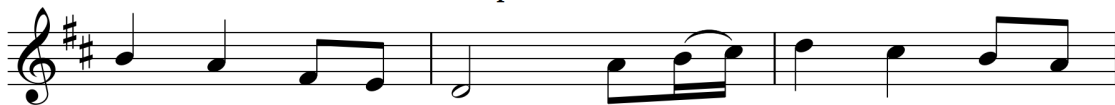

The Jewish feast of Passover was near. When Jesus raised his eyes and saw that a large crowd was coming to him, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" He said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." One of his disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, said to him, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" Jesus said, "Have the people recline." Now there was a great deal of grass in that place. So the men reclined, about five thousand in number. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them to those who were reclining, and also as much of the fish as they wanted. When they had had their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the fragments left over, so that nothing will be wasted." So they collected them, and filled twelve wicker baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves that had been more than they could eat. When the people saw the sign he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry him off to make him king, he withdrew again to the mountain alone.

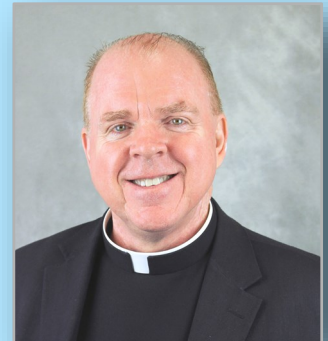

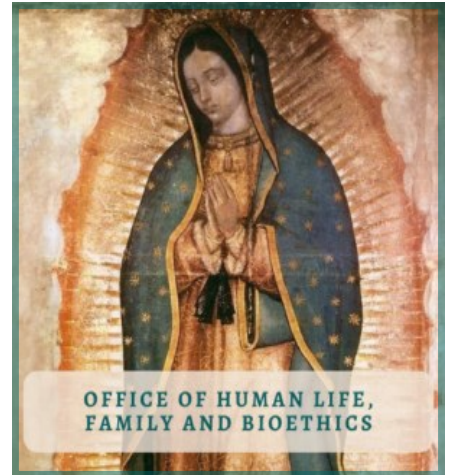
World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Dear Pastors,

Earlier this year, Pope Francis established the fourth Sunday of July as the annual **World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly**. Bishop Barres commissioned the Office of Human Life, Family and Bioethics with leading a Diocesan celebration that honors the important role of grandparents in passing on the faith and that also recognizes the value of all those in our community who are “rich in many years.” After more than a year of lockdowns and social restrictions which especially affected seniors, the need for such an observance is never more evident or timely!



This year, **World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly** will be celebrated on **Sunday, July 25**, and the theme will be **“I am with you always”** to focus on the closeness of God with the aged, and the closeness of intergenerational family ties. In planning for this day, with the uncertainty of the lifting of COVID-related restrictions, we deliberately avoided an emphasis of in-person activities which we hope to incorporate in future years. We wanted to let seniors know they are remembered and to help grandparents convey their Catholic Faith and traditions to their grandchildren. Please note these are suggestions we hope your parish will find useful, but we realize not only that this is short notice as we develop this new initiative but also that every parish is unique with different circumstances to accommodate.

First, to assure the elderly in our communities feel loved and valued, we have suggested **“Cherish a Senior”** in which parishes (especially families with children) may consider collecting small gift bags and/or friendly letters which will be distributed to clients enrolled in Catholic Charities programs (e.g. Meals on Wheels).

Second, to foster the **“Passing on the Faith”** role of grandparents, we are developing a microsite with suggested faith-based activities to engage with grandchildren. In particular, we would like to emphasize Blessed Carlo Acutis as a role model for young people to whom grandparents can introduce their grandchildren. Blessed Carlo’s passion for Jesus in the Eucharist, underscored by the theme of this year **“I am always with you”** and the urgent need to instruct our youth on the Real Presence.

For more details on both of these programs, please visit www.catholicgenerations.com. In addition, we are preparing a simple Action Guide for Respect Life leaders. It will include more detailed information on implementing the “Cherish a Senior” and “Passing on the Faith” program suggestions. We will be meeting with Respect Life leaders to update them so that we, as a Diocese, can most heartily respond to the Holy Father’s call to recognize the importance of older generations to all of us.

Thank you for your support of the activities of this Office, and in particular, in helping to make this day a very special occasion—not only for seniors and grandparents, but for all of us, that we may embrace the many gifts of advanced age: *“...at every stage of life the Lord can ask each of us to contribute what talents we have. The service of the gospel has nothing to do with age!”*
