




The Very Reverend Father Josef Norys, Canon Regular, will become our pastor effective June 29.

Still Too Many Holy Innocents!

Dear Friends.

I am deeply saddened by the massacre of innocents in our country. It recalls the tragedy of the Holy Innocents in the Bible, perpetrated by the death squad of an insecure and greedy King Herod. I believe this tragedy of the massacre of our children in Texas could have been avoided if everyone spoke with a consistent voice of Life. Once again, we will hear the words "thoughts and prayers" from leaders everywhere, a height of hypocrisy.

Our defense of human life and dignity can never be partial or a half-measure. How can we justify defending the dignity of some and not others or protecting God's creation while neglecting some of His most vulnerable creatures? We need to return to the visions of a "seamless garment" or "consistent ethic of life." Pope Francis is our champion when it comes to the defense of Life. Pope Francis said his



"heart is broken" after 19 children and two teachers died in this senseless shooting.

"It is time to say enough to the indiscriminate trafficking of arms, "he added. "Let us all commit ourselves so that such tragedies can never happen again." Would you hear such words followed by action from our Catholic Leadership in our country?

Archbishop Blaise Cupich wrote, "As I reflect on this latest American massacre, I keep returning to the questions: Who are we as a nation if we do not act to protect our children? What do we love more: our instruments of death or our future? The Second Amendment did not come down from Sinai. The right to bear arms will never be more important than human life. Our children have rights, too. And our elected officials have a moral duty to protect them."

Why do we remain so indifferent toward laws relating to gun ownership when innocent people and children are losing their lives every other day? Have we all become numb to the happenings around the world? Indifference or apathy is the sin of all sins. It has caught up with our church in the modern world. Some call it as the alpha sin, the worst of all sins. Indifference convinces us that change isn't possible. Left unchecked, it grows into a deep-rooted cynicism, the kind that gives the same response to personal transformation and societal injustice: "What for?" When this sin is full-grown, we no longer want ourselves or the world to change.

I feel that is where we are as a nation and as a people. But I am hopeful. I am hopeful not because our religious leaders and pastors will do the right thing, but I am hopeful because many of you are passionate about protecting life, and you refuse to give into despair or indifference. Keep up the good fight, peaceful fight, non-violent fight so that others especially our children can live without fear.




