Solemnity of The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

HOLY DAY MASS SCHEDULE 2022 Wednesday, December 7th: 4pm Thursday, December 8th: 8am and 7pm

On **December 8** we honor the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of the Savior of the World, under the title of "The Immaculate Conception."

This title acknowledges that grace filled her soul from the moment of her conception, thus preserving her from the stain of sin.

Though this truth had been held for centuries among the Catholic faithful, it was solemnly declared as a dogma of our faith on December 8, 1854, by Pope Pius IX.

By raising this doctrine to the level of a dogma, the holy father declared that this truth is to be held as certain by all the faithful. It is a truth found in the words of the angel Gabriel, "Hail, full of grace!"


