Thanksgiving Day Mass

The Annual St. Boniface Martyr Thanksgiving Day Mass, Thursday, November 24, will be celebrated at **9:30am**. You may bring food that you would like blessed for your Thanksgiving meal and place it before the altar.

The Mass intention will be in thanksgiving for all the living and deceased parishioners of The Church of St. Boniface Martyr.
