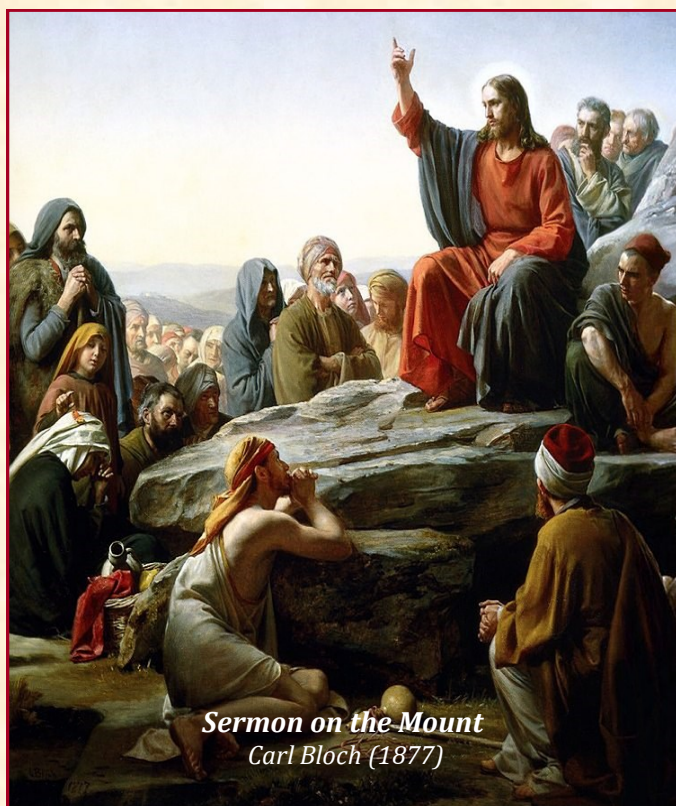

Saint Blase Blessing

Sickness and suffering confront most Christians at some time in their lives. Believers cherish the stories of Jesus' tender concern for the sick who sought to find relief and meaning in their struggles. The examples of a long line of Christian witnesses whose faith sustained them in time of trial offers us hope when shadows darken our lives. Saint Blase was such a person.

Blase served as bishop of Armenia in the fourth century. Little is known about his life, but tradition tells us that he saved a small boy from choking on a fish bone. Because of this, his help is sought for those who are sick, especially those who are afflicted with illnesses of the throat. On February 3, the Memorial of Saint Blase, the church continues its ministry to the sick with the blessing of throats.

This blessing invokes God's healing and protection. Two blessed candles are placed around the throat of each person seeking a blessing. Humbled by physical weakness and human limitations, we acknowledge our faith in God's protective love for all who call upon God's name.

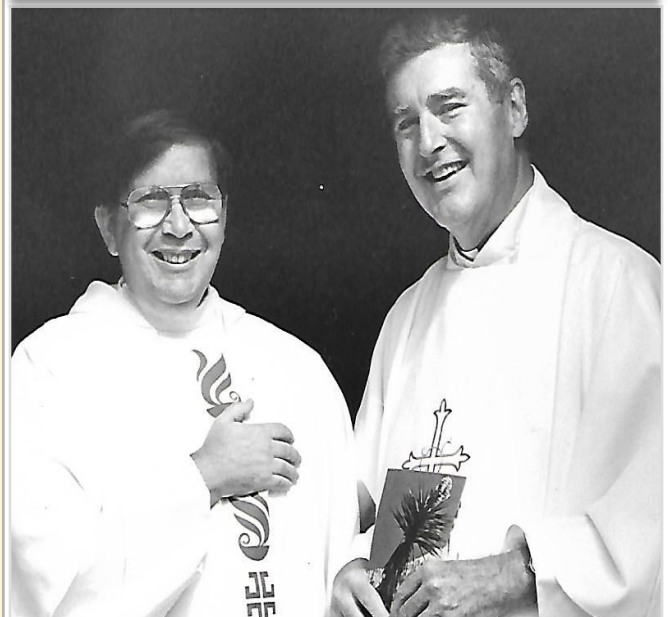
Today's Society of St. Vincent de Paul"

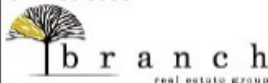

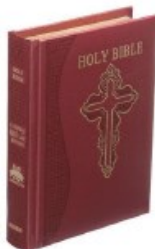
