Reflections on the Readings

A Better View

The journey of human life crosses many deserts. For years we await the realization of our dreams. We make sacrifices we hope will find reward. We sense the direction we are heading, but we do not know the obstacles along the way.

Looking back at the road we have traveled, we are amazed to have come so far. Looking ahead fills us with apprehension or adventure.

In the desert of life, we need reassurance. We need signs that we are on the right path, that our future still lies ahead, and that God has not abandoned us.

Crossing the desert, the Israelites approached such a place. They left one desert behind and entered the desert of Sinai. There Moses climbed the mountain, where he got a better view. God spoke to him, pointing out how far Moses had come, not just in miles, but also in intimacy. God had rescued the people from danger. If they remained faithful to the covenant, they would be God's special possession.

Every so often, we need that view. We need to look back for the strength to forge ahead. We discover in our past the care of God, and we build our trust in the future. Through this Sunday's rest, we recommit ourselves to our covenant.

Good News for Sinners

Reconciliation is a miracle. Whenever enemies make peace, the impossible seems to happen. Humans are capable of tremendous love, but we are also capable of enduring enmity. It is hard for two parties to retrace their steps, to understand the other position, and to come to a new level of peace. But it happens, and it always seems to be a miracle.


If miracles are to happen, you would expect them to reward those who are good. You would think that those who live in peace would receive the added blessings of God's love.

But the miracle of reconciliation often comes differently. It often comes when one or both parties are at fault. It comes to those who have sinned. Reconciliation happens to those who seem not to deserve it.

God's ways are not our ways. God sent Jesus to reconcile us, even though we human beings are sinners. And the miracle does not stop there. Having been reconciled to God, having experienced forgiveness, we can experience the joy of salvation.

St. Paul wrote to the Romans, "Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life." When we find ourselves at odds with someone, we tend to withhold reconciliation. We avoid making peace because we feel hurt, because we feel the offender does not deserve peace. God thinks differently. God created Reconciliation precisely with sinners in mind.

Matrimony: Engaged couples are to call the parish office before any other arrangements are made. A minimum of six months is needed.


