# St. Boniface Outreach

#### **Food Pantry: HELP NEEDED**

Recent events have had an impact on the number of families coming into the pantry. Where the numbers were around 35 families a week, the numbers have increased to over 60 per week. This has resulted in a lack of the basic food items we can provide. Currently we rely on single delivery every 5 weeks from our food bank, Long Island Cares. This source cannot provide a sufficient quantity of food. We need to increase our supplies. In order to do this, we need:

- ➤ A volunteer who can go to the Long Island Cares warehouse in Hauppauge two or three times a month to pick up an order.
- ➤ A volunteer who can go to Island Harvest on the 2nd and the 4th Tuesday of every month at JCC in Greenvale at 8:15 am.
- ➤ A volunteer who can go to the Island Harvest warehouse every Monday in the mornings at Uniondale to pick up food.

# Reflections on the Readings

#### Faithful Dissent

People who dissent from the teaching of the church find themselves caught between their loving trust of authority and the quiet but strong voice of conscience within them. They can see contradictions and ironies among the members of the community. When they form their disagreement they strive to do so in the charity demanded by the Gospel. If they dissent in anger, they damage the moral ground on which they stand.

The prophet Malachi faced a situation requiring faithful dissent. The priests had violated God's commandments. They offered animals of inferior quality in sacrifice. They did not teach people accurately. They showed partiality in their judgments. God spoke through Malachi to challenge the religious leadership of his day.

The prophet made his appeal based on the ideals of the community. He reminded the priests that all people shared the same God, who served as their creator and divine parent. God was their point of unification. Priests were responsible to God for observing the law, but they were also accountable to the community to sustain its covenant.

Malachi gives an example of faithful dissent: an opinion steeped in prayer, specific in its challenge, solid in its foundation of fidelity to God's Word

### The Message's Minister

The minister is not the same as the message. But the message will have power if the minister has love.

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy distinguished between the minister and the message in the First Letter to the Thessalonians. When they had first visited the community, they chose a gentle style—like a nursing mother caring for children. They brought the Gospel in love, not with force. "With such affection for you, we were determined to share with you not only the gospel of God, but our very selves as well."

The missionaries felt very close to the people they evangelized. They shared their faith, which was extremely important to them, but they also shared their lives—their joys and sorrows, their hopes and dreams. They all became friends. The community experienced together the love that Jesus had preached. The ministers and those they met worked hard together. They did not make the long journey in order to take advantage of the local population. Instead, they came on a mission of love, to preach about love, and to be love for their new friends.

God has entrusted each of us as a minister of the Word. We are not the same as the message, but the message will be conveyed by how we live. If we live in peace and friendship with others, we will proclaim the Gospel message in more than words.
