St. Boniface: This great apostle of Germany was born in England, between 672 and 680. When he was young, some missionaries stayed at his home. They told him all about their work, which impressed him. Boniface wanted to be just like them. He went to a monastery to be educated, became a popular teacher and when ordained a priest, was an enthusiastic and powerful preacher.

Boniface wanted everyone to know and love Jesus and his Church. He became a missionary to the western part of Germany and preached with great success. Once, to prove that pre-Christian gods were false, he did a bold thing. There was a huge oak tree the local people believed was sacred to their gods. In front of a large crowd, Boniface struck the tree with an axe. The people were enlightened when they realized their gods took no action against Boniface.

Boniface converted great numbers of people. In place of the statues of pagan gods, he built churches and monasteries. One day when preparing to confirm some converts, a group of armed inhabitants attacked the camp. Boniface died a martyr on June 5, 754.


