Kateri Tekawitha was born in upstate New York in 1656. Her mother was a Christian from the Algonquin tribe who had been forced to marry a Mohawk chief after being taken captive. When Tekawitha was four, smallpox ravaged her village, killing her parents and brother and leaving her face scarred and her vision blurry.

Tekakwitha embraced her mother's Catholic faith, but her adoptive aunt and uncle encouraged her to abandon her beliefs. When Tekakwitha was thirteen, her uncle arranged for her marriage. She refused the engagement.

When French Jesuits were allowed into the settlement, Tekakwitha told Fr. Jacques de Lamberville that she wanted to become a Christian. On Easter Sunday, at age twenty, she was baptized, taking the name Catherine, Kateri in Mohawk, after St. Catherine of Siena. After Kateri's baptism, she endured ridicule and was refused food for not working on Sundays. Fr. de Lamberville encouraged Kateri to move 200 miles north to the Mission of St. Francis Xavier near Montreal.

After two months of walking, Kateri reached the mission, receiving her First Communion on Christmas Day. Kateri embraced her faith, attending Mass daily and spending free time in the chapel. On March 25, 1679, Kateri made a vow of perpetual virginity, but poor health kept her from fulfilling her dream of founding a religious order for native girls. After her health deteriorated, she died at age twenty-four. Upon her death, her facial scars disappeared, as God made her face as beautiful as her soul. "The saint has died!" spread rapidly from village to village, across New France (Canada) and even to the Royal Court. Many miracles took place, especially for those who prayed at her tomb. Her affectionate nickname, "Lily of the Mohawks," honors her purity and her short life.

Kateri was beatified in 1980 (the first Native American and the first American lay person to receive this honor), and was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012. Her feast day is July 14.

Reflections On the Readings

God-Given Words

Amos 7:12-15

"Get out of here!" No one likes to hear those harsh words. Wherever we go, we like the assurance that the place where we have arrived is hospitable. If we upset the host, he may say those awful words.

That was the command that Amaziah the priest of Bethel leveled against the prophet Amos. Amos came from Tekoa of Judah in the southern part of the kingdom. At God's command he traveled to Bethel in the north to prophesy. He warned the people of God's judgment against them. The local priest didn't like hearing the message Amos brought. So Amaziah gave Amos a blunt and derisive retort: "Go home. Get out of Bethel. Go back to Judah. Prophesy there. Leave us alone."

There was one problem. Prophesying in Bethel wasn't Amos's idea in the first place. It was God's idea. God sent Amos from Judah to Bethel to bring divine judgment on the people. If God has given us words to speak, we stay and deliver them.

Blessings without Measure

Ephesians 1:3–14

Those born into a loving family receive blessings without measure. They are given a name and a nationality. They receive food and drink. They are kept clean and free from danger. They receive a language, a faith, a culture, customs, and an education. The gifts a family bestows cannot be numbered or adequately acknowledged.

As children of God, we have received blessings as well. The Letter to the Ephesians says we were adopted by God through Jesus Christ. We receive forgiveness. And we receive knowledge of the mystery of God's will. This incredible package of gifts is ours due to the goodness of God.

We are used to paying what something is worth and receiving a wage for our work. But once in a while, some merchant does you a favor. You get a rebate. You buy one and get one free. A debt is relaxed. And it feels like the mercy of God has fallen into your lap.

God has given us the greatest gifts freely.
Such generosity inspires us to give freely as well.
We share our income with those less fortunate—not because they did something for us, but because we want to be kind. We give up our time to help the church or community—not because we cannot pay for a service, but because commitment requires muscles, brains, and patience as well. God has blessed us, and we can share our blessings with the world.


Comings and Goings

Matrimony: Engaged couples are to call the parish office before any other arrangements are made. A minimum of six months is needed.






