This WEEK at HOME

Monday, March 24

Being Prophetic

Today we are reminded that responding to the call to Christianity is not easy. Jesus tells the people in the synagogue at Nazareth that "no prophet is accepted in his own native place." We know he will be rejected and crucified for his ministry. We are called to repent, to see God in all things, and to share our faith with others. This week, reach out to someone you love, and ask to share a prayer with him or her. If your invitation is accepted, lead with a simple prayer. If the invitation is declined, lift up the individual in your personal prayer.

Tuesday, March 25

Annunciation of the Lord

Understandably, Mary is "greatly troubled" when the angel Gabriel appears. Still, Mary courageously and faithfully responds yes to God's request. Her response is much like the words in today's psalm: "Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will." Set aside time to pray the Rosary. As you pray, ask for the humility to hear God and the courage to respond to God.

Wednesday, March 26

Teach Them

Moses reminds the Israelites to observe and teach the Lord's commandments, to share the goodness of the Lord that they have witnessed with their children and their children's children. Jesus tells his disciples that "whoever obeys and teaches these commandments will be called the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven." Say a prayer in gratitude for someone who taught you about your faith. Consider how you can teach others the way of the Lord with your actions and your words.

Thursday, March 27

Harden Not Your Hearts

We are reminded not to harden our hearts when we hear God. Jesus powerfully claims that "whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters." Reflect today on your Lenten journey. Have you taken time to listen to God? How have you responded? Commit to an action that will help open your heart to hear God's voice: consider attending daily Mass a few times during the week, praying at a consistent time daily, or journaling with regularity.

Friday, March 28

Sinners Stumble

Though we stumble, we are challenged to walk the path of the Lord. Jesus' answers to the query about the greatest commandment guides us in walking the path of the Lord. We are to love God with all our being and, from that, love our neighbor. Before going to sleep tonight, pray the examen. Saturday, March 29

A Heart Contrite and Humbled

Jesus' parable encourages us to give God "a heart contrite and humbled." The Pharisee, haughty and overly confident in being justified, compares his goodness to the tax collector and shares that he fasts, pays tithes, and keeps the commandments. The tax collector, on the other hand, repents and asks for God's mercy. Acknowledging our sins frees us and gives space for God's mercy. This weekend, offer God "a heart contrite and humbled" by going to confession.

Reflections on the Readings

God Answers

We all want to have our prayers answered. We think it would make life easier. But sometimes God answers them in a way that makes life more challenging.

Young Moses was minding his own business, tending the flock of his father-in-law, when God decided it was time to answer some prayers. For years the chosen people had been held in Egypt in conditions of slavery. They longed to return to their own land, the land that God had given them. They prayed for release.

God answered their prayers by appearing to Moses in a bush that was flaming but not consumed. God asked Moses to lead the people out of slavery into freedom.

This was probably not the answer Moses had in mind. Moses would have been content to let someone else lead the people to freedom. He wanted an end to slavery as much as anyone else. But he never envisioned that he would lead the exodus. God was answering his prayers, but in a way that caused anxiety for Moses.

When we want something done, God hears from us. When God wants something done, we hear from God. It may come as a surprise, but God may have us in mind to answer someone else's prayer.

Water in the Desert

In the desert of our lives there are plenty of complaints. Bills are too high. Friends are too few. Health is too frail. Faith is too weak. In the desert of our lives there is plenty of blame. Our leaders are unconcerned. Children are too demanding. Society is sinful. Life is not fair.

In the desert, the people of Israel grumble against Moses. They have too little water, and they are blaming Moses. Moses blames God and asks for some divine intervention.

God promises Moses, "I will stand in front of you on the rock." Moses strikes that rock, and water gushes forth.

Life brings its share of struggle. We sometimes rebel against the very place where God has invited us to be. We forget that God has given us life, has entered into covenant with us, and stands ever before us. So we complain. We may not realize that we are standing right at the water for which we thirst.

The discomforts of your life will not be hard to name. Have you brought some of them on yourself? Has God placed some of them in your path? Do you trust that God stands with you, water at the ready? From where will that water come?




